MOWW OVERVIEW

- **Congressionally Chartered**: MOWW is a congressionally-chartered Veterans Service Organization established in 1919.
- Non-Profit Status: MOWW is a 501(c)(19) Veterans Service Organization.
- **Membership Eligibility**: Officers and senior enlisted (E-7, E-8, E-9) from the Uniformed Services of the USA and their direct family members.
- Locations: MOWW has 72 Chapters across the US and Puerto Rico with over 6,300 members.
- Motto: "It is nobler to serve than to be served."
- **Focus**: Serving youth, community, and nation.

MOWW OUTREACH PROGRAMS

1. Patriotic Education

- Youth Leadership Conferences/ Youth Leadership Seminars: Multi-day (YLC) or single day (YLS) events to teach leadership skills and patriotic education.
- Phoenician Award National Essay Contest: Contest is available to top YLC students with cash awards for winners.
- National Youth Civics Summit: Opportunity for top-performing YLC students. This is a
 week-long, all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C., to explore civic education and
 government in action.
- Massing of the Colors: Patriotic ceremony held by MOWW Chapters to rededicate our faith in the United States, to present our support to the National Colors, and the Servicemen and Servicewomen those Colors represent.

2. Scouting

 Recognition of scouting excellence by Companions presenting MOWW's Eagle Scout, Venture Summit Scout and Sea Scout, and Gold Award Certificates of Recognition.
 Chapters also assist Troops, Groups and Councils in community projects, badge programs, etc.

3. ROTC/JROTC Support

 MOWW Companions present Award of Merit medal sets at ROTC/JROTC awards ceremonies through MOWW's ROTC Award of Merit Program to recognize cadet excellence.

4. National and Homeland Security

 Promoting and supporting community preparedness for national and local security concerns.

5. Veterans Affairs

 Service to veterans through support, participation in veteran events, encouragement, acknowledgements, and eternal honor.

6. Public Safety/ Law and Order

 Recognizes exceptional service in law enforcement, fire and rescue, criminal justice, and public safety; sponsors presentations; promotes related events and projects.

STEPS TO ENGAGE AND RECRUIT NEW MEMBERS

1. Start the Conversation

- Wear MOWW apparel to spark curiosity.
- Share your story and why you joined MOWW.
- Ask about their service: branch, rank, and leadership roles.

2. Qualifying Potential Members

- Ask about their service:
 - Where and when did you serve?
 - What was your role?
 - What was your rank upon leaving active duty?

3. Tailor the Pitch

- Community Service: Highlight the opportunity to strengthen their community.
- Patriotism & Civics: Share MOWW's dedication to promoting patriotic and civic education.
- Youth Leadership: MOWW encourages youth leadership (YLC/YLS, J/ROTC, Scouting).
- Veterans Support: Emphasize our commitment to helping veterans and involvement in Veteran events.
- Share real success stories to show MOWW's positive impact.

4. Simplify the Process

- Provide an application QR code or direct them to the MOWW website.
- o Offer to help with the application process and answer any questions.
- Offer to be their sponsor.

5. Engage New Members

 Actively involve new members in chapter activities to establish connections and commitment early on.

The Power of Storytelling in Recruitment

Storytelling is a compelling recruitment tool. Personal testimonies about how MOWW has impacted your life, community, or the youth you've met through MOWW Outreach Programs can inspire others to join. Encourage members to share their experiences at meetings, in newsletters, and on social media.

FAQS FOR PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS:

Q: How is MOWW different from other veteran organizations?

A: MOWW focuses outwardly on community service, youth leadership, and patriotic education, rather than lobbying or self-service. Each chapter tailors its outreach programs to meet their community's needs.

Q: What are the time commitments for members?

A: Members can engage at their own pace, whether by attending meetings, volunteering for an Outreach Program, leading initiatives, participating in events, or contributing in other ways.

Q: Can active-duty military join?

A: Yes, active-duty personnel are welcome to join.

Q: What if I am not a veteran?

A: You may qualify through a veteran family member, or you can join as a Patriot supporter.

Q: Why haven't I heard of MOWW before?

A: MOWW has been serving communities for over 100 years, focusing on direct impact rather than public visibility.
